introduced by Parsons to refer to the
characteristics of families of modern
industrial societies.

These families consist of a nuclear family
of husband, wife and their children.

They often tend to migrate to areas
away from their parental residence
to new places in search of jobs and
settle there starting neolocal trends.

These families share loose bonds with
their kins and extended family members.

Isolated nuclear families are more focused
on meeting their requirements and
hence don't maintain an active relationship
with kins and parents although they
are not totally cut off.

The trends are often seen in India in the modern times.

People migrate from villages to cities in search of job and stay there.

The cities of Mumbai, Chennai, Hyderabad etc harbour large number of such isolated nuclear families.

Often both ~~the~~ ~~male~~ husband and wife work and they actively share their family labour.

However Indian context also does not fully ~~satisfy~~ condition of Parson's

Indian nuclear families in cities very often take parental assistance in raising their kids.

It is a common practice to live young kids with grandparents while parents go for jobs.

Although contemporary trends do show some in nuclear families which show symptoms of detachment Indian nuclear families are generally ~~not~~ isolated.
